














THE MEKONG CAMBODIA & VIETNAM

HIGHLIGHTS



ANGKOR BAN & SILK ISLAND

Explore Cambodian village life in Angkor Ban with its wooden stilt houses. Travel by tuk tuk to Silk Island, where you will learn about the process of silk weaving from worm to loom.



Enjoy a walking tour of the village of Koh Chen and meet a local copper and silversmith. Discover the former royal capital Oudong, with its beautiful stupas and temples.







PHNOM PENH

Sip on a signature cocktail at the elegant Raffles Hotel, explore the majestic Royal Palace and Silver Pagoda complex, and discover the Khmer treasures of the National Museum.



TAN CHAU

Discover Vietnamese village life with a visit to a local temple, fish farms and stilt houses amidst the rice paddies, coconut groves and canals of Tan Chau.







PHU TAN

Visit a village famed for handmaking Ca Rang clay stoves. Used for centuries, these stoves have a unique wind-blocking design that retains heat and prevents ashes escaping.





TIGER ISLAND

Explore Tiger Island by three-wheeled xe loi (a motorised cart), learning about cottage industries such as plant pot making and incense making before hearing how the island won its name at 'Mr Tiger's Temple'.





LONG XUYEN

Travel by tender to witness the mesmerising Long Xuyen floating market and tour the An Giang Museum, with fascinating exhibits on Kinh Chinese, Khmer and Cham cultures in the region.





All aboard: Victoria Mekong

The four-star Victoria Mekong is a fresh, contemporary river vessel with four spacious passenger decks, offering a peaceful, premium small-ship experience between Vietnam and Cambodia.





YOUR STATEROOM

The Victoria Mekong boasts some of the most spacious cabins on the Mekong Delta, all outward-facing with private balconies. Her 33 en suite staterooms, each $25\mathrm{m}^2$, are spread across the Main and Upper decks along with two aft-facing VIP suites ($45\mathrm{m}^2$) at the rear of the Upper deck. All cabins can be booked as twin or double beds, and feature rain showers, hair dryers, individually controlled AC and French windows onto the balcony.


FACILITIES ON BOARD

The Victoria Mekong was designed with relaxation in mind. Guests are invited to soak up the sun in the outdoor infinity pool, try their hand on the mini-golf green, watch films or documentaries in the on-board cinema, indulge in a treatment at the Green Lotus Spa, or enjoy the daily activities held in the Lounge Bar. For those who simply wish to relax, sun loungers and parasols are available on the Sky Deck, while books and games are available to borrow from the library. Where possible, the Captain is pleased to invite guests to visit the bridge.

WINE & DINE

The Claypot Restaurant, located on the Upper deck, is an airy, spacious venue with large bay windows offering 180-degree river views, along with a terrace for al fresco dining. All meals are included; cuisine varies each night, with set menus available at dinner.

Asian hospitality is widely regarded as some of the best in the world, and the Victoria Mekong is no exception. House wine is complimentary with dinner, along with a daily sunset cocktail and free-flow soft drinks and beer. Additional snacks and spirits are available from the Lounge Bar.









YOUR JOURNEY


The Mekong is the seventh longest river in all of Asia, and the twelfth longest in the world. Stretching 4,345 kilometres from China across the Tibetan Plateau and through Myanmar, Laos, Thailand, Cambodia and Vietnam, it empties into the South China Sea south of Saigon. It is the lifeblood of Southeast Asia, and many centuries of cultural, economic and political history have played out on its banks.

The Victoria Mekong cruises from Kampong Cham in Cambodia to the Vietnamese town of Can Tho in the Mekong Delta. Guests can join the full 7-night cruise, or opt for a shorter 4 night option beginning or ending at Sisowath Quay in Phnom Penh. Alternatively, guests can opt for the 3-night sailing from Kampong Cham to Phnom Penh.


Along Victoria Mekong's route, she calls at ports such as Tan Chau, Long Xuyen and Tan Loc Island, with excursions to historic temples, silk villages, the Royal Palace, the Killing Fields and a floating market. See page 6 & 7 for more information about her ports of call.

Guests on all itineraries will enjoy nightly evening entertainment on board, ranging from Cambodian Apsara performances to traditional Mekong folk music and even a mischievous lion dance on the sun deck. Onboard activities range from mini-golf to cocktail-making competitions, destination presentations and film nights.

ITINERARY

DAY 1: FLY TO PHNOM PENH

Fly to Phnom Penh, Cambodia's capital. Depending on your time of arrival, the rest of the day is yours to start soaking up the local culture.

Explore the magnificent temples of Angkor

DAY 2: EXPLORE PHNOM PENH

Explore Phnom Penh, a European-feeling city of airy boulevards and colonial villas. Though it is still scarred by the events of the 1970s, the city has been renewed with energy and optimism. Enjoy a guided tour of the city, stopping to visit the magnificent Royal Palace, Silver Pagoda and National Museum, Visit the city's chief landmark, the temple of Wat Phnom, before an afternoon at leisure.

DAY 3: PHNOM PENH

This morning, learn about Cambodia's tragic past under the Khmer Rouge regime with visits to the Tuol Sleng Museum and the Killing Fields. Return to Phnom Penh in the afternoon, with time to explore further.

DAY 4: TRAVEL TO BATTAMBANG

Journey to Battambang, Cambodia's lesserknown city. With a population of less than 120,000, Battambang is a laid-back city nestled on a bend of the Sangkae River. Set in some of the country's most beautiful landscapes, Battambang is also home to Cambodia's grandest colonial architecture.

DAY 5: HISTORIC BATTAMBANG

This morning, explore a traditional local house for a glimpse of rural life. Head out of town to the 12th-century Banan Temple and admire the breathtaking hilltop views. Pause to witness a local phenomenon - hundreds of thousands of bats erupting from the hillside as dusk falls over the countryside.

DAY 6: SIEM REAP & CIRCUS

Travel west to Siem Reap, arriving in the afternoon. Enjoy time at leisure before dinner. This evening, enjoy a rollicking performance by the graduates of the Phare Cambodian Circus. This NGO organisation transforms the lives of disadvantaged local youths, providing them with a formal education and vocational training in the performing arts.

DAY 7: EXPLORE ANGKOR

The Angkor Archaeological Park encompasses over 1,000 temples, all the remains of different capitals of the Khmer Empire between the 9th and 15th centuries. Our tuk-tuk tour begins from the old city of Angkor Thom as we pass through the magnificent South Gate flanked by 54 gods and demons. At Angkor Thom's centre is the enigmatic Bayon, a breathtaking temple of innumerable sculptural decorations. Also admire the Elephant Terrace and the Terrace of the Leper King. Continue to Ta Prohm before the rest of the day is dedicated to Angkor Wat, the most magnificent and best preserved of all of Angkor's treasures. Later, take a leisurely boat ride on the moat of Angkor Thom and view hidden elements of the old Khmer water systems.

DAY 8: COOKING CLASS

Join a traditional Cambodian cooking class at an organic farm, learning about the flavours that go into Khmer cuisine. This afternoon, enjoy a tour of some of Cambodia's social enterprises dedicated to fostering positive change, learning about the impact of their remarkable work on local communities.



DAY 9: COUNTRYSIDE EXPERIENCE

Head out of Siem Reap to enjoy an immersive countryside experience. Visit a number of farms and local villages part of the Trei Nhoar Community and discover the true essence of Cambodia, witnessing a more traditional way of life, untouched by modernity, as you gain insights into daily life of the rural Khmer population. Enjoy a home-cooked meal with the locals and return to Siem Reap in the late afternoon.

DAY 10: VICTORIA MEKONG

This morning, transfer to Kampong Cham to embark on your next adventure - a threenight cruise on our premium small ship, the Victoria Mekong. Begin your cruise with a complimentary cocktail on deck, watching the sun set.

DAY 11: ANGKOR BAN

Explore the laid-back village of Angkor Ban with its wooden stilt houses. This afternoon take a tuk-tuk to Silk Island to learn about the process of silk weaving from worm to loom.

DAY 12: OUDONG

Enjoy a walking tour of Koh Chen village, where you'll meet a local copper and silversmith, before continuing to the country's former capital, Oudong. Arrive in Phnom Penh and end the afternoon in style with a signature cocktail at Raffles Hotel Le Royal before returning to the ship.

DAY 13: KAMPOT

Disembark the Victoria Mekong and depart Phnom Penh, heading for the coastal town of Kampot, stopping en route at a pepper farm to learn about the famous Kampot pepper.

Enjoy a walking tour of Kampot, a charming town characterised by its colonial architecture.

DAY 14: KAMPONG TRACH CAVE

Visit Kampong Trach Cave, with its breathtaking limestone formations. Continue to Trapeang Sangke, a community-based initiative dedicated to preserving mangroves in the area, and enjoy a boat trip through the vast mangrove forests.

DAY 15: RETURN TO PHNOM PENH

Return by road to Cambodia's capital. This evening, admire modern Phnom Penh as you sip a cocktail at a local sky bar, and consider how this reinvigorated capital is moving forward.

DAYS 16-17: FLY PHNOM PENH TO AUSTRALIA

Fly to Australia, arriving home the same or the following day.

ITINERARY

DAY 1: FLY TO SAIGON

See life on the Mekong River

Fly to Saigon, Vietnam's largest and most evocative city. Depending on your time of arrival, the rest of the day is yours to start soaking up the local culture.

DAY 2: DISCOVER SAIGON

This morning, visit the fascinating Cu Chi Tunnels to learn the history of the Viet Cong and their guerrilla tactics during the Vietnam War. Return to Saigon, a vibrant, modern city with a treasure trove of fascinating heritage. See the colonial Notre Dame Cathedral, visit the magnificent Central Post Office, and the emotive War Remnants Museum. There'll also be a coffee break at one of Saigon's best coffee workshops. Dinner this evening will be at Noir, a restaurant employing visually impaired waiters, for a sensory 'dining in the dark' experience!

DAY 3: TO THE MEKONG DELTA

Drive southwest to Can Tho, stopping en route for a delicious local lunch. Board the four-star Victoria Mekong cruise ship which, after a welcome briefing, will cast off into the waters of the Mekong Delta. Begin your cruise experience with a complimentary cocktail on deck, watching the sun set as the ship makes its way upriver. Tonight, drop anchor at Tiger Island.

DAY 4: TIGER ISLAND AND FLOATING MARKET

Cruise upstream to Long Xuyen and disembark to visit a floating market and a local museum. After lunch, enjoy an excursion on Tiger Island, exploring by sampan and visiting local industries. Sit down to dinner and evening entertainment before retiring to your cabin. Drop anchor at Vam Nao.

DAY 5: PHU TAN & TAN CHAU

Start the day at Phu Tan, visiting a craft village famous for its handmade clay stoves. Used in the delta for centuries, these stoves have a unique design to protect them from the wind. Return to the ship and cruise to Tan Chau during lunch. On arrival, head to shore to visit a colourful Cao Dai temple and a local market. This evening features a thrilling lion dance performance!

DAY 6: INTO CAMBODIA

Today, the Victoria Mekong will pass over the border into Cambodia and sail towards Phnom Penh. Spend a leisurely day enjoying the passing scenery and a wealth of onboard activities, such as lectures and cocktail making. In the late afternoon, dock at Phnom Penh's Sisowath Quay where, this evening, you will be entertained with a traditional Cambodian apsara performance. Sip a farewell cocktail before a final dinner on board.

DAY 3: THE TEMPLES OF ANGKOR

Journey into the old city of Angkor Thom. At its heart is the enigmatic Bayon, an iconic temple of innumerable sculptural decorations. Admire the Elephant Terrace and Terrace of the Leper King before continuing to the atmospheric Ta Prohm. The rest of the afternoon is dedicated to Angkor Wat, the most magnificent and best preserved of all of Angkor's treasures. As the sun sets, float peacefully on the moat that surrounds Angkor Thom, soaking up the atmosphere. Sit down to a welcome dinner with the group this evening.

DAY 4: TONLE SAP

Travel to the shores of Tonle Sap and visit the floating village of Kampong Phluk (Oct to Feb) or Chong Kneas (Mar to Sep). Stop at Chansar village for a glimpse at rural life before visiting the home of a local Khmer family.

DAY 5: PHNOM PENH

Travel to Cambodia's charming capital, Phnom Penh. Board a cyclo and head into the heart of the city to visit the magnificent Royal Palace official residence of the King - along with the Silver Pagoda in its grounds.

DAY 6: THE VICTORIA MEKONG

Spend the morning reflecting on Phnom Penh's tragic past with visits to Tuol Sleng Museum and the Killing Fields.

After lunch, embark on your next adventure a four night cruise on our premium small ship, Victoria Mekong, with her 35 outward-facing cabins. Enjoy a welcome cocktail and Apsara dance performance before dinner.

DAY 7: INTO VIETNAM

The ship departs this morning, with plenty of onboard activities available; alternatively, spend the morning relaxing in the pool. Sail into Vietnam around lunchtime, anchoring near Tan Chau. Tender ashore to visit a Taoist temple and see the intriguing stilt houses. Return to the ship in time for an exciting lion dance performance on the Sky Deck as the sun sets.

DAY 8: PHU TAN & TIGER ISLAND

After breakfast, tender ashore in Phu Tan to visit a craft village famed for its handmade clay stoves. After lunch, anchor at Tiger Island and head ashore to explore, learning about local industries such as ceramics and incense making. Return to the ship in time for a cocktail competition and the evening's entertainment.

DAY 9: LONG XUYEN & DINH YEN

Arrive in Long Xuven and hop on a tender to visit the bustling floating market. Stop in town to visit a museum with exhibits on ancient cultures on the region before returning to the Victoria Mekong. 




YOUR JOURNEY

ITINERARY

DAY 1: FLY TO SAIGON

Fly to Saigon, Vietnam's largest and most evocative city. Depending on your time of arrival, the rest of the day is yours to start soaking up the local culture.

DAY 2: EXPLORE SAIGON

See the sights of the city this morning, admiring the colonial architecture of the Central Post Office and Notre Dame Cathedral, visiting the fascinating Reunification Palace, and viewing the exhibits of the War Remnants Museum. Later, discover the reality of guerrilla warfare at the Cu Chi Tunnels, which were central to the Viet Cong's military operations, including the Tet Offensive. For a truly authentic insight into the war, meet a Vietnamese veteran and hear his story.

DAY 3: DISCOVER THE MEKONG DELTA

Travel to the Mekong Delta, taking to the canals and palm-lined waterways by boat, to admire its verdant and bountiful beauty and catch a glimpse of daily life. Return to Saigon, stopping en route at a chocolate factory, where you'll learn about the bean to bar production process.

DAY 4: FLY TO DANANG

Fly to Danang and transfer to Hoi An, a UNESCO listed town renowned for high-quality tailors. The afternoon is free to explore.

DAY 5: HOI AN ON FOOT

Start the day on a walking tour of Hoi An, a wonderfully atmospheric, laidback and traditional city, wandering the cobbled streets of the old town to spot hidden temples, historic merchant houses and to visit the famous Japanese Bridge. At Phuoc Kien Assembly Hall, a special experience awaits in

the form of personalised blessings presented in symbolic red envelopes.

DAY 6: FLY TO HANOI

Fly to Hanoi, Vietnam's capital city. On arrival, visit the fascinating Museum of Ethnology before hopping into cyclos for a ride through the streets of the city's vibrant Old Quarter.

Head out on foot to explore Hanoi's rich history and culture. Starting at the 11th-century northern gate, the entry point of the imperial citadel of Thang Long, continue to Cua Bac Church and along Phan Dinh Phung, considered Hanoi's most beautiful street. Pause to discover Quan Thang Temple, walk along the West Lake and browse the stalls of Chau Long market. Later, meet with a local master for a workshop with traditional zo paper, using brush pens and ink stones to learn the art of calligraphy. Pay a visit to a Yen Thai community.

DAY 8: BOARD YOUR CRUISE

Travel to Halong Bay and board your river cruise vessel, home for the next 10-nights, before enjoying lunch and setting sail into the beauty of this UNESCO-listed bay. This evening, enjoy a welcome cocktail on deck surrounded by spectacular scenery, anchoring in a sheltered bay.

DAY 9: EXPLORE HALONG BAY

Spend the morning sailing on turquoise waters among limestone islands and rock formations. Stop at Viet Hai Village, boarding an electric buggy to explore the vegetable gardens and typical rural houses. Back on the water, cruise towards Lan Ha Bay to visit a floating fishing house then, if the weather is good, sip a cocktail on a beautiful beach.

DAY 10: MORE HALONG BAY

Take to the waters yourself in a kayak or board a local basket boat rowed by a fisherman to visit 'Dark and Bright Cave', entering it by water to admire the massive stalagmites hanging for the ceiling. This afternoon, bid farewell to Halong Bay and enter the Kinh Thay River, dropping anchor near Hai Phong.

DAY 11: KINH THAY RIVER

Observe life on the Kinh Thay River. A key commercial waterway, its banks are dominated by industry that is essential to Vietnam's economy. This afternoon, visit the Thanh Ha Commune, the place considered to be the birthplace of Vietnam's famous water puppets. Take a stroll through the village before settling under a shady tree by a pond full of lotus and lilies to enjoy a private water puppet show.

DAY 12: DAY RIVER

Sail along the Lower Red and Day rivers this morning. Get better acquainted with your cruise vessel with a ship tour before lunch onboard. Head ashore to explore Co Chat silk village, where you can meet local craftspeople and watch them make silk by hand and visit the local markets to browse the wares.

DAY 13: RED RIVER DELTA

Sail towards Ninh Binh, mooring at Khanh Thien Village. Disembark to visit Phat Diem and its cathedral which blends Vietnamese and European architectural styles. Explore Khanh Thien Village and discover some lovely local handicrafts, like water hyacinth weaving, rice paper and cakes. This evening, enjoy a performance of 'Chau Van' singing by the locals, an ancient artform of the area.

DAY 14: NINH BINH

Experience 'Halong Bay on Land' at Ninh Binh, boarding small bamboo rowing boats to pass through a river landscape of lush paddy fields, limestone peaks and caves. Return to the ship and sail upstream on the Red River, towards Hanoi.

DAY 15: HISTORIC HANOI

Arrive back in Hanoi and experience the city from a different angle. Tour what remains of the notorious 'Hanoi Hilton' prison before soaking up the tranquillity of the Temple of Literature and learning at the life of revolutionary leader and president Ho Chi Minh at his mausoleum. Then walk through the bustling streets of Hanoi's Old Quarter, stopping to enjoy the delights of a Vietnamese delicacy, egg coffee, seeing how it is made and how good it tastes. Return to the ship for a relaxed evening and delicious dinner.

DAY 16: BAT TRANG VILLAGE

Visit Bat Trang ceramic village which has produced ceramics famous throughout Vietnam for generations. Returning to the ship, a local dance troupe will perform a lion dance on the pier. Set sail for the upper reaches of the Red River, a less explored area, stopping at a village dedicated to the production of 'non la', Vietnam's famous conical hat. Then, stop at the lakeside 11th-century Thay Pagoda to explore its exquisite temples and the surrounding village.

DAY 17: UPPER RED RIVER

Among the industrial architecture of the Upper Red River, there are still wonderful pockets of a Vietnam of the past, including the UNESCOrecognised Duang Lam.

ITINERARY

DAY 1: FLY TO KOLKATA

Fly to Kolkata, a vibrant city in the far east of India. Depending on your time of arrival the rest of the day is yours to start soaking up the local culture.

DAY 2: EXPLORE KOLKATA

The capital of West Bengal and widely considered India's cultural capital, Kolkata is a place of fascinating contrasts, something that you will explore on today's tour of the city. See landmark sights like Birla Planetarium, Belur Math, Dakineshwar Kali Temple and the spectacular white marble edifice of the Victoria Memorial before, this evening, taking a walking tour to Park Street, the famous thoroughfare in Kolkata's downtown area.

DAY 3: BRITISH KOLKATA

The capital of the British Raj between 1858 and 1911, Kolkata is home to a series of colonial sights which you will visit on this morning walking tour, including the stately Dalhousie Square. This afternoon, you'll pay a visit to Mother House, a quiet convent that was home to Mother Teresa and still houses her missionary sisters today. Visit her tomb and a small museum dedicated to her life and work.

DAY 4: TRAVEL TO GANGTOK

Transfer to the airport and fly to Bagdogra. On arrival, drive to Gangtok, winding through the incredible landscapes of Sikkim, with towering Himalayan peaks as your backdrop.

DAY 5: EXPLORE GANGTOK

Sikkim's bustling state capital, Gangtok sits on the side of a hill overlooking the valleys and peaks of the Himalayan foothills.

Today you will explore it, visiting the 18th-century Rumtek, the region's most spiritually significant monastery, Enchey Monastery with its colourful prayer hall, the Tashi Viewpoint, where you'll get spectacular views of Mount Khangchendzonga and more. You'll also fly your way up the cable ropeway for panoramic views of the city and its surroundings.

DAY 6: TRAVEL TO DARJEELING

En route, you'll stop at the Ravangla Buddha Park to admire a 40-metre-tall copper Buddha set against a mountainous backdrop.


Rise before dawn and travel up Tiger Hill to watch the sun rising (weather dependent) over Kanchendzonga which, at 8,586 metres, is the world's third highest mountain. The rest of the morning is at leisure before an afternoon ride on the Darjeeling Himalayan Railway's Toy Train from Darjeeling to Ghoom. Visit Ghoom Monastery before returning to Darjeeling to tour the Padmaja Naidu Zoological Park, the Himalayan Mountaineering Institute and Tibetan Refugee Center. This evening, enjoy a stroll through the market.

DAY 8: FLY TO GUWAHATI

Transfer back to Bagdogra airport and fly to Guwahati. The rest of the day is at leisure.

DAY 9: BOARD YOUR CRUISE

Transfer to Silghat, a port on the Brahmaputra River, where you'll board your river cruise vessel.



Wander the colourful Rumtek Monastery



With a spa, saloon, and spacious sun deck along with cool and roomy cabins with floor-to-ceiling sliding windows for optimum views, there is no better to explore the rich riverbanks of the mighty Brahmaputra. Cast off and begin your upstream cruise, enjoying lunch and dinner onboard.

DAY 10: KAZIRANGA SAFARI

This morning, disembark from the ship and take a jeep safari into the central range of the Kaziranga National Park. A UNESCO World Heritage Site, Kaziranga is best known for its population of Indian one-horned rhinoceros and is a designated tiger reserve. Alongside these two magnificent creatures, Kaziranga is also home to elephants, sloth bears, pangolin, water buffalo, swamp deer and a number of species of primate, among much more, and is an important habitat for birds. Enjoy a riverside lunch at Diphlu River Lodge before hopping back into jeeps to explore the park's western reaches, where there is even more wonderful wildlife to spot.

DAY 11: TEA ESTATE

Spend the morning on a tea experience on a picturesque Assam tea estate. Here you'll learn all about the production process, from plucking the leaves to brewing a cup. Back on the boat, cruise upstream, passing through more of Kaziranga National Park's spectacular wilderness, spotting wildlife on the banks of the river as you go. Drop anchor near Biswanath village.

DAY 12: BISWANATH VILLAGE

Head into the village, where there is a rich, cultural heritage to explore. Biswanath's ghat is home to a cluster of temples dedicated

to different gods, including an Ahom-era Shiva temple – discover these and have a wander through the town, soaking up the beautiful riverside and rural surroundings. Continue cruising through Kaziranga National Park, keeping a look out for wild elephants. Then, spend the afternoon up on the ship's sun deck where you may be lucky enough to spot a member of a small population of the endangered Ganges River dolphins.

DAY 13: DAY OF CRUISING

Today you'll be able to sit back, relax and watch the river landscapes drift by as you cruise upstream. There will be one stop at a rural riverside village where a walking tour is a great way to stretch your legs.

DAY 14: MAJULI ISLAND

Explore one of the world's largest river islands, Majuli, which is a fascinating microcosm of local culture. Visit two of the island's tranquil satras (monasteries) that have been essential in preserving Assamese art and culture and enjoy a traditional dance performance. Cruise farther upstream to Salmara Ghat, visiting a nearby village that is known for its traditional handicrafts, to see the artisans at work.

DAY 15: VISIT SIBSAGAR

Transfer by car to Sibsagar. Once the capital of the Ahom kings, explore the remnants of a fascinating culture with visits to old temples and examples of innovative engineering. Return to the ship and cruise back to Neamati Ghat for your final night onboard the ship and a farewell dinner.



Wander along the promenade of this former French colony established in 1673. Explore the colonial era buildings including the former French governor's residence, now converted to a museum, and the beautiful Sacred Heart Church, designed by French architect Jacques Duchatz.





Visit the weaving village famous throughout India for its sarees. Watch the skilled locals engaged in handloom weaving using a mixture of cotton and gold thread, one of the most time and labour intensive forms of weaving.

A rural town, Guptipara is renowned for its paddy fields and the Himsagar mango. Visit the Vaishnav temples that contain some delightful terracotta works and visit a potter's home to see and interact with the artisans at work.





KALNA

Ride electric rickshaws to the enchanting Rajbari Temple Complex, which has the highest concentration of temples in the region. Discover the enchanting architecture and artwork depicting historical epics and return to the ship walking through the local vegetable market.





MAYAPUR

Experience fascinating Krishna culture at the headquarters of the International Society for Krishna Consciousness, where the new temple has been compared in scale and grandeur to the Vatican. You'll also have the opportunity to meet Krishna followers and walk through the pilgrim's bazaar.





DAY 1: FLY TO DELHI

Fly to Delhi, India's rumbunctious capital city. On arrival, transfer to your hotel where the rest of the day is yours to refresh, relax or begin exploring your surroundings.

Stand in awe before the magical Taj Mahal

DAY 2: DISCOVER DELHI

Embark on a city tour, starting in atmospheric Old Delhi with a rickshaw ride through the bustling streets. You'll dive straight into the narrow, fragrant lands of Khari Baoli Spice Market to marvel at the array of colourful herbs and spices before visiting the immense Jama Masjid, a Mughal masterpiece of a mosque. DAY 4: TAJ MAHAL SUNRISE

Rise early for an unforgettable experience, sunrise at one of the world's most beautiful buildings! As the sun creeps over the horizon, the Taj's white marble facade shifts through shades of pinks and reds as it emerges from the dawn mist in an ethereal display of beauty.

After breakfast back at the hotel, visit a marble inlay workshop to see skilled artisans crafting intricate designs. Depart Agra for the city of Gwalior. Take a tour of the city, learning about its fascinating history with visits to its magnificent fortress, the Gujari Mahal Archaeological Museum, Tansen's Tomb, and the Jai Vilas Palace, which house the Scindia Museum.

DAY 5: TRAVEL TO KHAJURAHO

Board a train to Jhansi then drive to Khajuraho, stopping en route at Orchha to visit its beautiful temples. There are even more temples to explore in Khajuraho, a city famous for its group of 10th-century Hindu and Jain structures. A fascinating balance of architecture and sculpture the temples. which are a UNESCO World Heritage Site, are decorated with intricate erotic carvings and are considered one of the great masterpieces of Indian art. Today you'll view the eastern and western groups of temples.


DAY 6: TRAVEL TO VARANASI

Transfer to the airport and fly to Varanasi. This afternoon is at leisure before you embark on a rickshaw ride through the city's life-filled streets. Later, witness the mesmerising Ganga Aarti ceremony, with its rhythmic chants, flickering oil lamps and prayers dedicated to the river.

DAY 7: DISCOVER VARANASI

Sacred Varanasi, one of the world's oldest living cities, sits on the banks of the River Ganges. This morning, arise at dawn for an atmospheric boat ride, taking in the famous ghats as the spiritual come down to the river to bathe in its holy waters.

Then, explore the city farther venturing down atmospheric alleyways to temples filled with pilgrims and the faithful. This afternoon, venture to Sarnath to explore ancient Buddhist sites.

DAY 8: FLY TO KOLKATA

Travel to the airport and board a flight over to India's eastern reaches, to the city of Kolkata.

DAY 9: BOARD YOUR CRUISE

Cruise by Howrah Bridge

Transfer to the jetty and board your river cruise vessel, settling into your spacious cabin as the boat casts off to sail upstream on the Hooghly River, a distributary of the Ganges. Head to the sun deck as you pass under the Howrah Bridge, one of Kolkata's most iconic sights before mooring near Bally Bridge on the outskirts of the city.

DAY 10: CRUISE TO BANDEL

Sit back and enjoy the river landscapes drift by as you cruise upstream. Stop to visit the Hoogly Imambara, a mosque and congregation hall built in 1841 on the bank of the river. As well as being a beautiful and attractively crumbling, storied structure in the Indo-Saracenic style, the Imambara is famous for its giant mechanical clock.

DAY 11: RAJBARI TEMPLE COMPLEX

Continue upstream to Kalna, where a shore excursion will include a ride in electric rickshaws, which will whisk you off to the Rajbari temples. Here you can explore a range of different architectural styles and carvings depicting Hindu epics. Returning to the ship, pass through a local market to see the produce on sale.

DAY 12: LOCAL VILLAGE WALK

MV Ganges Voyager

This morning as you sail towards Nabadwip, enjoy the facilities onboard your boat or relax and enjoy watching the world go by. Later, walk through a riverside village for a glimpse at rural life and pay a visit to the artisans who handloom cotton fabric for saris and scarves. Cross to the other side of the river to Mayapur and the headquarters of the International Society for Krishna Consciousness. Stroll through the pilgrim's bazaar and meet Krishna followers and visit the temple itself.

DAY 13: VISIT ARTISANS

Sail to Guptipara and venture out of the town to see rice paddies and plantations where mangos are being harvested. Then see the town's Vaishnav temples to admire the terracotta works before visiting the home of potter to see artisans at work with clay. Cross the river to the weaving village of Fulia to meet this time, artisans who specialise in the production of jacquard and jamdani sarees.

DAY 14: CHANDERNAGORE

Turn downstream and cruise to Chandernagore, a former French colony. Here you'll stroll along the promenade and admire the French colonial architecture and pay a visit to the grand French governor's residence, now a museum, and the Sacred Heart church. Continue the journey downstream to Kolkata, pausing at Serampore, a town that was part of Danish India from 1755 to 1845. Enjoy a walk through the old quarters and see the Danish tavern and St Olav's Church. Sit down to a farewell meal back onboard your ship.

Cruise out to the island temple of Philae, relax in the gardens of Elephantine Island and drift on white sailed feluccas through this timeless landscape.





ABU SIMBEL

Journey south to the great temple dedicated to Ramesses II, with its immense 66-foot-high statues. Once gazing out over the southern reaches of the Nile, the entire temple was moved block by block 200 metres from its original location to avoid the encroaching waters of the Aswan Dam.







This morning, we visit El Alamein, the site of two key battles in WWII. The Allied victory in the second battle was instrumental in ending the Axis threat to Egypt. Visit the military museum and war cemeteries before travelling southeast back to Cairo. Stop en route to visit the historic Monastery of St Macarius, continuously inhabited by Coptic Orthodox monks since the 4th century AD. Tonight, stay in a hotel close to Cairo Airport.

DAY 7: LUXOR'S EAST BANK

Sail on to Aswan, where we dock for the next two nights.

DAY 10: ABU SIMBEL

Visit the iconic and unforgettable Abu Simbel, at Egypt's furthest edge. This dramatic temple complex, perhaps the greatest in Egypt, is dedicated to Ramesses II, often considered the greatest pharaoh of the New Kingdom. Admire the many halls and imposing statues. Afterwards, enjoy lunch at a traditional Nubian restaurant in a beautiful setting beside Lake Nasser before returning to the ship in Aswan.
