Day 1: **Arrive Tokyo**

Travel to the dazzling metropolis of Tokyo, Japan's capital city. Upon arrival, transfer to your hotel. The rest of the day is at leisure.



Destination Information

Tokyo - One of the world's most cutting-edge capital cities, Tokyo is a city of contrasts, famous for its neon lit landscape, towering skyscrapers, peaceful shrines and lovingly tended gardens. Although long the political and cultural centre of Japan, Tokyo became the official capital when the Meiji Emperor moved it to Tokyo in 1867.

Day 2: Nikko Day Trip

Your guide will meet you at your hotel in Tokyo and together transfer to Asakusa Station by public transport to board the Limited Express train to Nikko.

Today you will visit the magnificent Toshugo Shrine, followed by a visit to the impressive 100m-high Kegon Falls.

Later, return to Tokyo by the Limited Express train.

Destination Information

Toshugo Shrine - The elaborate memorial to Tokugawa leyasu, the founder of a shogunate that ruled for over 250 years. The lavishly decorated shrine complex consists of more than a dozen buildings set in a beautiful forest.

Your guide will meet you at your hotel in Tokyo and together walk to Shinagawa Station to board the local train to the coastal city of Kamakura.

You will begin your visit at Kotokuin and the Hase Temple. Then stroll through Kamakura Komachi Street, which is lined with charming shops and restaurants.

End your day with a visit to the Hokokuji Temple, before returning to Tokyo by local train.




Kamakura - A coastal city south of Tokyo, Kamakura is known for its dozens of unique temples. Kamakura is one of Japan's ancient capitals and it served as the seat of the Kamakura shogunate from 1185 to 1333.

Kotokuin - A Buddhist temple whose grounds house Japan's second tallest bronze Buddha statue.

Day 4: Depart Tokyo

Your day is at leisure until the time comes to transfer to the airport for your onward flight.
