ITINERARY

Day 1: Arrive Shanghai

Meals: None

Make your way to Shanghai airport or railway station. Upon arrival, you will be met by your local guide, who will transfer you to your Shanghai Hotel. The rest of the day is at leisure.

**Destination Information**

Shanghai - Once known as the 'Paris of the East', Shanghai is now one of Asia's most influential cities. Prior to communist arrival in 1949, Shanghai was a city with European-style mansions and was the most important trading port in Asia. Today it presents a blend of cultures; the modern and the traditional, along with the European and oriental.

Day 2: Shanghai

Meals: B, L

Start your day with a relaxing stroll through the beautiful Yu Gardens and the Old Town where cobblestone streets are lined with traditional shops.

Later, visit the famous historical riverfront area known as the Bund, see intriguing antiques and fine arts at the Shanghai Museum. Also visit the silk factory and see first-hand the process of producing this fine material.

**Destination Information**

Yu Gardens - Built by the Ming-era governor, Pan Yunduan, as a retirement gift for his father, the Yu Gardens is home to exquisite jade rock, ponds and tranquil pavilions.

The Bund - Recognised as Shanghai's former 'Wall Street', the Bund is home to an impressive collection of buildings from the early trade houses of the 1850s to the glamorous Art Deco modernism of the 1920s. Originally the home of the foreign population of Shanghai, the Bund's architecture has inherited much western influence.

Shanghai Museum - One of the most esteemed and acclaimed museums in China, the Shanghai has a comprehensive collection of ancient Chinese art. The shape of the museum was designed to resemble a Chinese vessel, known as a Ding.

Day 3: Depart Shanghai

Meals: B
