ITINERARY

Day 1: Arrive Tokyo

Meals: None

Travel to the dazzling metropolis of Tokyo, Japan's capital city. Upon arrival, you will be met and transferred by public transport to your hotel. The rest of the day is at leisure.



Destination Information

Tokyo - One of the world's most cutting-edge capital cities, Tokyo is a city of contrasts, famous for its neon lit landscape, towering skyscrapers, peaceful shrines and lovingly tended gardens. Although long the political and cultural centre of Japan, Tokyo became the official capital when the Meiji Emperor moved it to Tokyo in 1867.

Day 2: Tokyo Meals: B

Spend a full day exploring Tokyo, making use of the city's excellent public transport with a guide. Start by visiting Sumida Hokusai Museum, before heading to Meiji Shrine. Afterwards, continue on to discover the fast-paced districts of Harajuku and Omotesando.

This afternoon, visit the Tokyo Government Building's observatory deck for panoramic views of Tokyo and beyond. Then spend some time exploring the bustling entertainment district of Shinjuku, before returning to your hotel.



Destination Information

Meiji Shrine - Meiji Shrine is a Shinto shrine dedicated to the Emperor Meiji and his wife Empress Shoken. The shrine is located in an evergreen forest within in the busy city and consists of 120,000 trees which were donated by people from all over Japan when the shrine was established.




Day 3: Kamakura Day Trip

Meals: B

Meet your guide and transfer by local train to Kamakura.

You will begin your visit at Kotokuin and the Hase Temple. Then stroll through Kamakura Komachi Street, which is lined with charming shops and restaurants. You will end your day in Kamakura with a visit to it's most important shrine, Tsurugaoka Hachimangu.





Destination Information

Kamakura - A coastal city south of Tokyo, Kamakura is known for its dozens of unique temples. Kamakura is one of Japan's ancient capitals and it served as the seat of the Kamakura shogunate from 1185 to 1333.

Kotokuin - A Buddhist temple whose grounds house Japan's second tallest bronze Buddha statue.

Day 4: Depart Tokyo

Meals: B

Your day is at leisure until the time comes to transfer by public transport to the airport for your onward flight.
